TAIKO DRUMFEST CONCERT & FUNDRAISER FOR JAPAN TSUNAMI APPEAL

The Taiko Drumfest Concert in East Kilbride was a great success, with a stunning performance by the full compliment of the Dojo Performance Team. The concert also featured a guest appearance by participants of the Glasgow & Edinburgh courses, for a total of over 40 drummers taking part in the event.

Due to the disaster in Japan, we decided to make the Drumfest a fundraiser for the Red Cross Japan Tsunami Appeal, and we were delighted to raise over £2,200 for the appeal, consisting of the full proceeds of the night, the proceeds of a raffle (a big thank you for the generous donations of prizes) & a donation by South Lanarkshire Council. Thank you to all who contributed & everyone who took part in the fundraising event. It was but a small drop in the ocean in what is a huge reconstruction effort in Japan, but we were delighted that we were able to give back a small amount to the country which gave us so much & set us on our taiko path.







THE WAY OF THE DRUM TOUR - JUNE 2011

The Way of the Drum tour in June was a great success, and was guite possibly the most eventful tour of our history. We started with four concerts in the Channel Islands: Guernsey, Jersey, Sark and Alderney. For our travel between the islands, the music council had organised a boat charter for us, which we welcomed after our experiences on our previous Channel Island visit with chartered flights being grounded due to fog. However, our excitement over having our own boat was to be short-lived, as we soon found out that we were to take to the seas in a small fishing boat, with our equipment strapped to the deck, when all ferries had been cancelled due to rough sea conditions. Our fearless skipper, Cap'n Ray did a fine job of steering the small boat through the rough waves, with all of us flung from side to side inside the boat as the the waves crashed over us, soaking all of our equipment despite our best efforts wrapping the cases in tarpaulin. Sick bags were distributed all round and we were all worse for wear after each journey. Despite this, our day in Jersey was a highlight of the tour: after the treacherous morning journey from Sark, we performed live on the radio, then an afternoon schools performance for the local kids, then a standing ovation at the evening concert. We certainly slept well that night!

At Cumbernauld Theatre we were delighted to welcome onstage the participants of our taiko courses for a short guest spot - well done to you all for your energetic performance. At Wem Town Hall we were excited to perform in front of a hall full of taiko players, thanks to the teaching efforts of James Barrow at the local schools there. Thanks to all of you for your support!

Our final "Way of the Drum" concert was at the Portsmouth Cathedral, where the taiko created a deep resounding sound throughout the magnificent stone edifice, making for a very memorable conclusion to an eventful tour.













DOJO TEAM SUMMER SHOWS

It has been a busy summer of performances for our Dojo Team: street performance at the multicultural Mela festivals in Glasgow & Edinburgh, busking at the Portobello Big Busk, entertaining dignitaries at the Alnwick Gardens, and a stage set in front of thousands of revelers in Kircudbright.

One highlight was the Edinburgh Marathon, where the Dojo members split into five separate teams, each team encouraging the runners as they went by, then driving to the next point en route in a relay system, entertaining the runners throughout the whole route.
